The Hispanic-Serving Health Professions Schools (HSHPS) will be hosting a Hispanic/Latino Immigration Health and Faculty Development Workshop in collaboration with our 24 member institutions, as well as the Stanford Hispanic Center of Excellence, the U.S. Mexico Border Health Centers of Excellence, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The event will take place at Stanford University, School of Medicine in Stanford, CA July 22-24, 2010.

The event will bring together senior faculty members to discuss the leading issues in Hispanic/Latino immigration health. The Faculty Development Workshop is for junior Hispanic/Latino health scholars will follow and complement the event's goal of improving and encouraging research in Hispanic/Latino health.

HSHPS will award several outstanding Hispanic/Latino faculty members with a comprehensive award package covering registration cost, lodging, food, transportation, and partial economic round trip airfare between the faculty member's institution and Stanford University¹.
